RECIPE CORNER

This month's recipe is perfect for marinating those dinosaur ribs you'll collect at the 1 Million B.C. shoot! Seriously though, it makes a delicious change for the BBQ. It works best on Korean-style beef ribs, but can be also used on chicken or flank steak.

Korean BBQ Marinade

1 c. soy sauce
½ c. sugar
¼ c. sesame oil
3 (I use 5 or more) garlic cloves, minced
6 green onions, chopped
2 tsp. ginger root, finely chopped
½ tsp. red chili pepper flakes, optional
1 Tbs. toasted sesame seeds

Mix ingredients together in a medium saucepan. Simmer to mix flavors and melt sugar. Cool, then pour over ribs or chicken to marinate overnight.

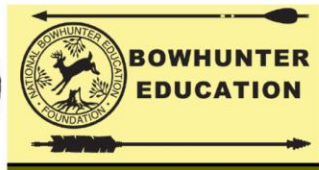
