MEMBER'S CORNER

THE GIFT OF HOME SCHOOL AND MARTIAL ARTS

We, like many other people, were not aware there was a Home School Program offered by the Pacifica School District and feel blessed to have found it. The program's head teacher is Mrs. Kathy Green, who has been teaching for 14 years. Reading is her favorite subject and is probably why she is a Reading Recovery teacher for the district as well.

This is Mrs. Green's second year in the program and she loves it. It was spring 2009 when we came to the conclusion that what our local school district called 'the best middle school they had to offer' was far from the mark. We had visited the school unannounced to see what the environment was like for ourselves. It was a chaotic, four letter word filled, violent disaster with uniforms slapped on it like a useless band-aid.

After doing some research into other school districts close to us we discovered the Pacifica Home School Program. After speaking with Mrs. Green on the phone for 45 minutes I felt like I had known her all my life. I knew we had found our answer. It turns out there are many parents out there like us. Either their local district can't offer a suitable learning environment, is lacking what is needed for a child with a different learning style, or they have a child that just doesn't fit in.

Mrs. Green informed us the program is flexible, and she helps with creating lesson plans. We meet every two weeks to evaluate the completed work and



get another lesson plan. The district provides all the books. There are field trips once a month, special science and art classes, opportunities to join the instrumental music program with free karate classes for physical education.

Yes, that's right; free physical education through non-contact martial arts movement at the Family Martial Arts Center in Pacifica which is run by Sensei Lee Byrd. Our children have been going there, since starting the home school program, three days a week and love it. I have joined in the classes too. Two of our three children are now an orange belt and the other a camo belt.

As of February 22nd, there are 37 students enrolled in the program. Mrs. Green informed me the program may be in danger because of budget cuts. This sends the feeling of panic through parents like myself. If you think this program might work for your family or know of someone it might benefit, please contact the Pacifica School District. It just might save the gift of home school and martial arts that my family has been so blessed to receive.
