At the February work party, we had 2 awesome re-baling teams who knocked out five target stations in desperate need of replacement. The "Red" Team rebuilt targets #'s 1, 2, & 4 on the red. The "White" Team re-built targets #'s 10 & 8 on the white. "THANK YOU" to all the strong men who came together and accomplished this physical task. The noontime lunch bell did not stop them from completing the work at hand. In the next couple of months, we must focus on preparations for our upcoming

Traditional Rendezvous in April and range inspection in the Spring.

MARCH GENERAL MEETING - Our next *work party & general meeting* is scheduled for March 9th. Nominations are now open for the treasurer's position and we will be voting by private ballot at the March General Meeting at 1pm. Please come out & exercise your right to VOTE! Message from the Range Captain:

This has been a month of great cooperation and bitter disappointment. First the good news. San Francisco Archers continues to have great work party responses from baling to target making to trail cleaning and a special thanks to John Talamontes for felling the dangerous tree next to the bridge on White #4. After waiting for SF



Parks, the Golf Course, Lawns and Trees, it was apparent that no one has the direct responsibility for our beloved range. John saw the problem and with an expert arborist's skill dropped the nuisance tree next to the bridge.

SF Archers will be ordering 100 new bales and will be bringing several shooting stations up to snuff. More members are learning the secrets of baling from Jim Robinson, Josh Porter and long time range masters.

Dennis Wuhl will be adding more cable railing to the bridges and Patrick and Brian will be improving the stairs and laying new treads. The Big Filipino guys, Albert and Mark have learned to replace the bales and we think we have the process streamlined for safety, speed and efficiency. The Feb 9th work party was a major success with 8 stations being replaced with new bales and a nice BBQ provided by Kin Shu and helpers. Good job!!

For the bad news, a metal cabinet purchased with SF Archers funds for the storage of teaching bows and equipment was vandalized by a long time member whose family has long been honored and respected for their contributions and service to the club. An ax used for the wood burning stove was used to strike the cabinet causing significant damage. Fortunately, because the cabinet had not yet been re-keyed for universal access by all club members, no valuable bows were being stored. The Pacifica PD was called and a criminal complaint was filed. The recording was viewed by the responding officers and has been submitted as evidence for follow-up investigation and prosecution. SF Archers will ensure that members and guests and their assets and personal safety continue to be the highest priority. Destructive, violent or criminal behavior will not be tolerated. Those members or guests deemed to be disruptive, violent, destructive or refuse to take safety instruction from anyone observing unsafe practices will be ejected from the grounds, and club membership will be reviewed by the Board. SF Archers will be moving to file a restraining order against the responsible party, barring him from the premises.

Herb Leong will be replacing the current grey market cheapo security camera system with a reliable user friendly system formerly used by Genentech.
