It's getting hard to keep track of who's going where and what everyone's placing! **That's a GREAT problem to have.** Congratulations to ALL those who are placed 1st/2nd/3rd in each category and PROPS to all of you who are traveling all over the place to represent yourselves and SF Archers at these shoots. Placing or not, you are out there having fun and shooting your bow. You are visiting different ranges, making new friends, getting to know and helping support the archery community and other clubs! I've recorded at least a half dozen or more members attending each of the following shoots and many placing in their category. Tournaments in June include the Santa Cruz Stickbow and 3D in the Redwoods, The State Field Championship, BHU's Hunt Tune-Up in Cupertino, Briones Bear Creek Unmarked in Orinda, Kings Mountain 3D in the Redwoods in Woodside and the California State Outdoor Championship in Longbeach, CA. Those who have never shot at another range, I encourage you to attend some shoots! There are always fliers located in the clubhouse and check the CBH calendar for upcoming tournaments.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT SHOOTS

Our WNS have been quite successful! We are averaging between 20 - 40 archers a week, attracting both members and non-members alike. (can always count on you), Josh P., Rich F., Rudy S., Jack R., and a few impromptu guys who hopped in and helped along the way. Same gratitude goes to the take down crew who are pretty much the guys who stick around and make sure the animals are put

away (Steve S., John T., etc.). Thanks to Jack R., Kin S., Pat H., Mike P., Allen E., and Nancy R. for your helping hand in the kitchen! Lastly thanks to Sean D. and Allan H. for manning the registration.

*I'm always looking for other members who are available to help so we can have a healthy rotation of volunteers.

Volunteer Information:

- Members who can arrive BY 4 pm to help set up 14 3D targets. One mandatory open bed truck to transport animals. 2 - 4 volunteers max. FREE shoot entry, dinner and raffle ticket.
- Two or more members w/an open bed truck to take down targets at 7:45 pm.
- Kitchen help including prep, serving and cleaning up. Usually a rotation occurs so that those who want to shoot can also shoot.
- Registration takes 1 - 2 volunteers from 4 pm - 7 pm (again, rotation works good here)

Shoot Information:

- Registration begins 4 pm. *Rolling start* begins at 5 pm until 7 pm. It takes about an hour to complete the course.
- Shoot Fee **includes** dinner: Members **\$10**, Guests **\$15**, ALL KIDS under 18 **\$5**.
- Two or more arrows ok, field points ONLY. Optional scoring (11, 10, 8, 5)
- Follow the course, maps available. WHITE RANGE is CLOSED during from 4 pm - 8 pm.
- One Raffle Ticket per shoot fee. Year-end raffle!

ONE MILLION B.C. SHOOT AUGUST 3rd & 4th

PLEASE mark your calendars NOW for our biggest shoot of the year!

New this year -- We are scheduling an **aerial archery clinic** Saturday afternoon followed by a “**Smoker Round**”. The Smoker Round is *a separate entry fee* to shoot ten 3D North American animals at our upper range. You have only **one arrow** to complete a fairly challenging course laid out like hunting conditions. ****Winners for TOP Male and Female for both Compound and Trad. ****

I would appreciate the HELP of ALL our members! Remember, **EVERY member can pitch in.** It's **NOT** all *heavy lifting*! We will need help from trail clearing, marking, cleaning, shopping, cooking, etc. VOLUNTEERS are needed to “RUN the SHOOT”. I know many of our members are planning on shooting the tournament. If you are planning to shoot both days for score, please make sure you help as much as you can the Friday before and/or the special work parties we have leading up to the shoot. Many of our members will sacrifice by NOT shooting one or both days so they can help run the shoot. The more members we have step up, the better it will be for everyone!

Range Captain's Message:

Great weather and our well-maintained range have brought out new archers and old hands alike as never before. Member volunteers are busy teaching and replacing and caring for the range and machinery long past the normal lifespan are now wearing out. Our two poor mowers are both down and we will move ahead to replace them with something more suited for our terrain.

A walking trail still needs to be cut through the shooting alley enabling JOAD and FITA archers to access the upper range without stopping action on the practice range.

We will be trying out some new ideas which I hope will save money and time in baling and maintaining the shooting stations. We have replaced some of the metal banding with cargo tie-downs - easier to replace by any member and will (hopefully) outlast the metal banding which rusts out many times before the bales are due for replacement. Anyone which extra nylon strapping or tie-downs sitting around the garage are encouraged to bring it in. We expect that the strapping will be cut by errant arrows, but will be repairable with a simple knot. Members who



are truckers or contractors will be familiar with the cargo knot, which may be used without the ratchet buckle.

Heads up: A tweaker and past thief and vandal was sniffing around the clubhouse again and was seen going under the arrow shack to retrieve something. History lesson: At one time the club had a groundsman that lived in a trailer on the range. The trailer became a crack house and the tweaker and his girlfriend were finally ejected and the range no longer allows a resident. The tweaker set his trailer on fire after it was towed off the property. The front gate was crashed and tools and cash stolen from the lock boxes and yellow fee pole. This Same Guy was seen at the clubhouse recently. Jim Long set him on his way this time.

Members are encouraged to help protect our stuff. The park is for the safe enjoyment of everyone with a few simple rules and respect for the rights of others.
