BREAK-INS AT THE RANGE!!!

SFA has been victimized twice in March. The first break-in was to the storage container that holds all the large equipment. The large chainsaw and power tool kit were stolen. The hasp to the lock was cut to gain access to the container. The lock was repaired and fortified the next day. Then a few days later another container was broken into in the same manner. This time two weed whackers were stolen. This lock was repaired and modified after the last break-in. A wheelbarrow was taken also, probably to aid in removing the stolen items. These two

thefts have resulted in losses totaling more than \$2,000.00.

The Board asks that members please keep an eye out for any suspicious activity and non-member vehicles that may be in the area for extended periods of time. We've all worked hard to bring in the funds to purchase the equipment needed to maintain the range, and it is devastating to lose so much in a short period of time.

Please make sure all ladders and tools are returned to their proper places and locked up at all times when not in use to help minimize any future losses.

RECIPE CORNER

I received a lot of requests for this recipe, which is so easy that I'm kind of embarrassed to admit that I'm not the whiz I have been pretending to be! I cut back by ¼ cup on the sugar in the original recipe and changed up the fruit. You can use almost any combination of fruit and flavorings (I'm thinking mango/blueberry with lemon or lime juice next).

Peary-Berry Thingy

4 ½ Tbl. Unsalted butter
¾ cup all-purpose flour
½ cup sugar
1 ½ tsp baking powder
Pinch of salt
¾ cup milk
¾ tsp vanilla
½ tsp almond extract
1 to 1 ½ cup sliced or diced, peeled pears
½ cup fresh or frozen raspberries, (adjust sugar depending on sweetness of berries)

Powdered sugar, for dusting

Cut the butter into chunks and toss into a 9-inch deep-dish pie plate. (Pyrex or ceramic works well.) Place in a 350°F oven for 5-8 minutes, or until butter is melted. Meanwhile, whisk together dry ingredients in a mixing bowl. Add milk, vanilla, and almond extract and whisk until smooth.

Pour batter over the hot butter, top with the fruit. Bake 45 min., or until top is browned and a toothpick poked into the center comes out clean. As they bake, the fruit will sink to the bottom and form their own layer. Cool 30 min., dust with powdered sugar. Serve slightly warm, straight from the dish. Also delicious topped with whipped cream or vanilla ice cream!


